This is Daniel O'Connell's family crest.

The colours and pictures used on crests all have a special meaning.

Can you see the stag on the O'Connell crest?

A stag is often a symbol of peace and harmony.

Underneath the stag there are three words: 'ciall agus neart'.

This means:

wisdom and strength.

This is the motto of the O'Connell family. Many family crests have a motto.



The 1916 Easter Risin9

What do you already know about the 1916 Easter Rising?

You may remember that it began on Easter Monday (which fell on the 24 April in 1916). The rebels wanted to gain independence for Ireland from Britain. They took control of many strategic (important) buildings and locations in Dublin and used the General Post Office (GPO) as their headquarters.

Do you know who delivered the surrender to the Easter Rising?

It was the woman pictured on the left, Elizabeth O' Farrell. She was a member of Cumann na mBan (a women's group that wanted to get independence for Ireland) and was stationed in the GPO. She tended to the injured and acted as a messenger.

She travelled to Galway to announce that the Rising was going ahead and made her way back to Dublin by train!

Elizabeth is buried in Glasnevin Cemetery. She died in 1957.





Margaret Skinnider was a maths teacher from Scotland, who was also an expert markswoman!

She too was a member of Cumann na mBan and came to Dublin for the Rising.

She was a sniper on the roof of the College of Surgeons, on St. Stephen's Green. She was shot three times in one incident during the Rising and later remembered thinking: "It's all over, as I felt myself falling. But a moment later, when I knew I was not dead, I was sure I should pull through." She stayed in Dublin and worked as a primary school teacher until 1961.

She died in 1971 and was buried in Glasnevin Cemetery.



A group of Irish Volunteers (marching from Maynooth to the GPO) took the chance to rest and slept in Glasnevin Cemetery.



The man who raised the tricolour flag over the GPO (on the first day of the Rising) is buried in Glasnevin Cemetery.



Éamon de Valera was in command of Boland's Mill during the Rising.





The Maynooth 15 - There was confusion as to when the Rising would start and so a group of Irish Volunteers (a military group that wanted to achieve Irish independence) in Maynooth did not get word of fighting until the Rising had already started.

They decided to march to Dublin and cut through Glasnevin Cemetery (wading through the River Tolka) at night and took the opportunity to rest.

They later arrived at the doors of the GPO with extra men and ammunition!



Gearóid O'Sullivan was a teacher and a member of the Irish Volunteers. He raised the flag on the roof of the GPO on the first day of the 1916 Easter Rising.



During the Rising **Éamon de Valera** was in charge of Boland's Mills. He later became Taoiseach of Ireland and was the President of Ireland for 14 years.
